Flood in the Night

Heavy winds lash through the streets. Ominous storm surge warnings blare. A Baltic coastal town faces imminent evacuation. Amidst the urgency, Elisa lingers until the eleventh hour, finding herself in eerie company: her neighbors, inexplicably delaying departure. The couple – just like Elisa – seem to be hiding something.

Four narrative perspectives, none of them reliable, and four secrets that threaten to come to light as the flood surges: Stina Westerkamp's thriller is as claustrophobic and as it is chilling – and certain to make massive waves.

The Celebration

In the heart of midlife, Jakob, once a celebrated film director, faces a desolate existence. His career lies in ruins, his last love affair a distant memory. Grey hair, a frail body, and his mind barren of ideas.

On the morning of his fiftieth birthday, Jakob solemnly declares that there is nothing worth celebrating. But his longtime friend, Ellen, disagrees. She propels him on a journey through the tapestry of his life – a pilgrimage to reunite with those he once held dear, those he believed were lost to time. Among them: the great love he left, a former best friend whose bond now echoes in the distance, the companion who ignited his passion for Jim Jarmusch’s films, and a childhood friend whose memory occasionally stirs within him. As the day unfolds, these encounters culminate in a rendezvous at a dimly lit restaurant – and Jakob, until almost the end, clings to the belief that they are mere coincidences.

The Celebration is a book about loss, forgiveness, and the profound impact of friendships. With deep melancholy and unflinching humor, the protagonist reflects on his life – a life that is just beginning.

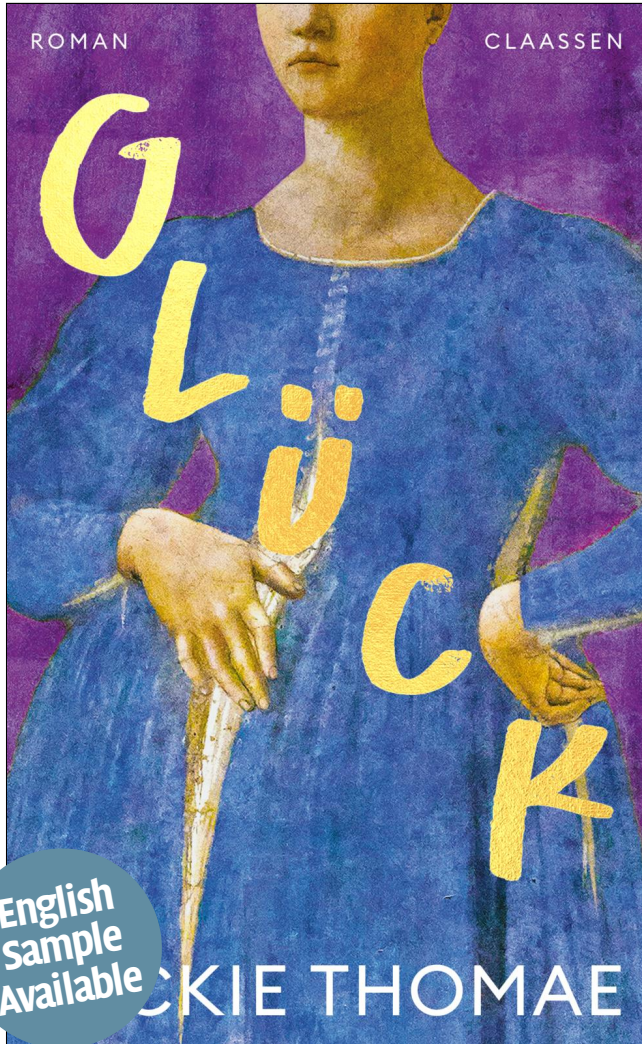

Where is Hannah? The mystery of her disappearance two years ago weighs heavily on her family and the entire village. Her sister Luisa leads a group of seven people through the forest every Saturday, hoping to find a trace of Hannah.

Amidst the persistent uncertainty surrounding Hannah's disappearance, Scherzant zooms in on the lives of those who refuse to give up the search. Once a multitude, they now number only a few. Frank, a paramedic, nursing his broken heart in silence. Inge, mother to a teenager, tirelessly drives everyone through the forest, while her life at home is falling apart. Amaka grapples with a diffuse phantom pain. Emma, Enrico, Christina, and Hartmut each carry burdens of their own. Luisa, who dropped out of her studies to support her family, is torn between despair, anger, and sadness. They know the chances to find Hannah are slim, but all cling to the weekly searches for dear life. Because together they are less alone.

Journalist Benedikt struggles to find his footing after graduating and ends up working as a communications consultant for a populist politician. This new job brings him uncomfortably close to the reactionary camp, prompting the women in his life – his partner Marianne, his sister Agnes, and his mother Edith – to question his values. How did he, raised in a liberal and anti-authoritarian household, end up here? What unresolved grief, denial, and long-buried family patterns have driven him to this point?

The answer leads to Herzach, the place in Bavaria where Benedikt spent the summer vacations of his childhood, and to the fishery that has been in the family for generations – and which is now facing ruin. When history is close to repeating itself, Benedikt must decide whose footsteps and politics to follow.

Desiderium is a captivating family novel that brings the past into sharp focus by exploring why we perpetually repeat the same mistakes. The book unflinchingly examines fascist legacies and material continuities, revealing how history, both large and small, shapes our present. A timeless narrative, written for the moment.

Regina embodies the quintessential post-war generation woman. She had many opportunities afforded to her, pursued a psychology degree, dreamt of an academic career – only to set her ambitions aside after all, for the sake of her family. Now, she channels all her hopes and aspirations into her daughters, Antonia and Wanda.

Antonia consistently undermines expectations, drops out of university, and becomes a single mother. Wanda meets every expectation but spirals into an eating disorder, ignored by those around her. Throughout their lives, the sisters waver between competition, independence, and a yearning for their mother's recognition; even beyond her death. Over two decades, we follow the three women, right up to the third generation, as they struggle for the one thing they lack: the feeling of being loved.

With a keen power of observation, unexpected humor and tenderness, Anna Brüggemann weaves a mother-daughter story that is also the story of so many who have come up against motherly expectations. It speaks so much delicate, brutal truth about all the indelible early imprints we all carry and can never quite escape.

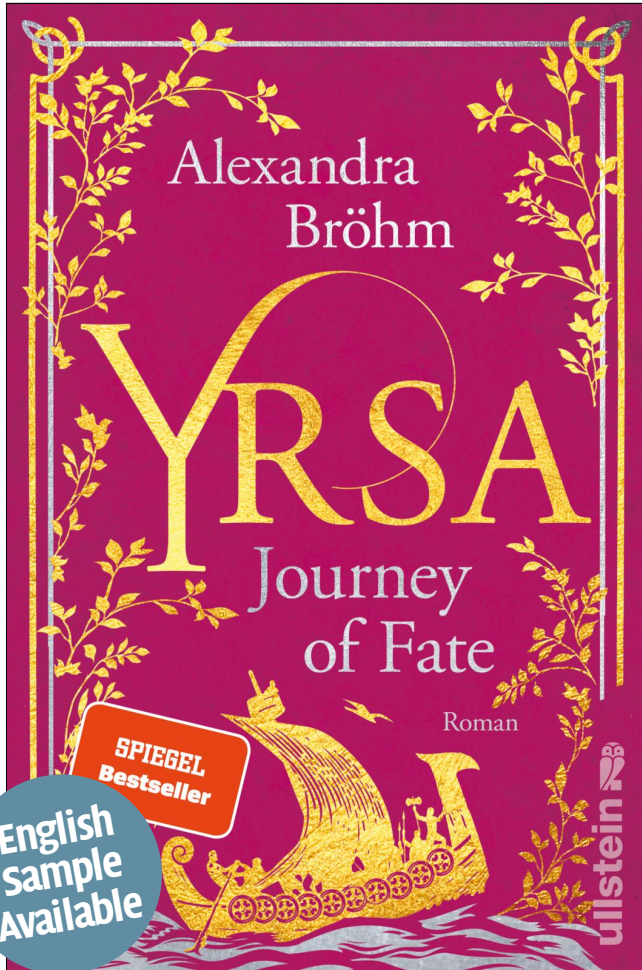

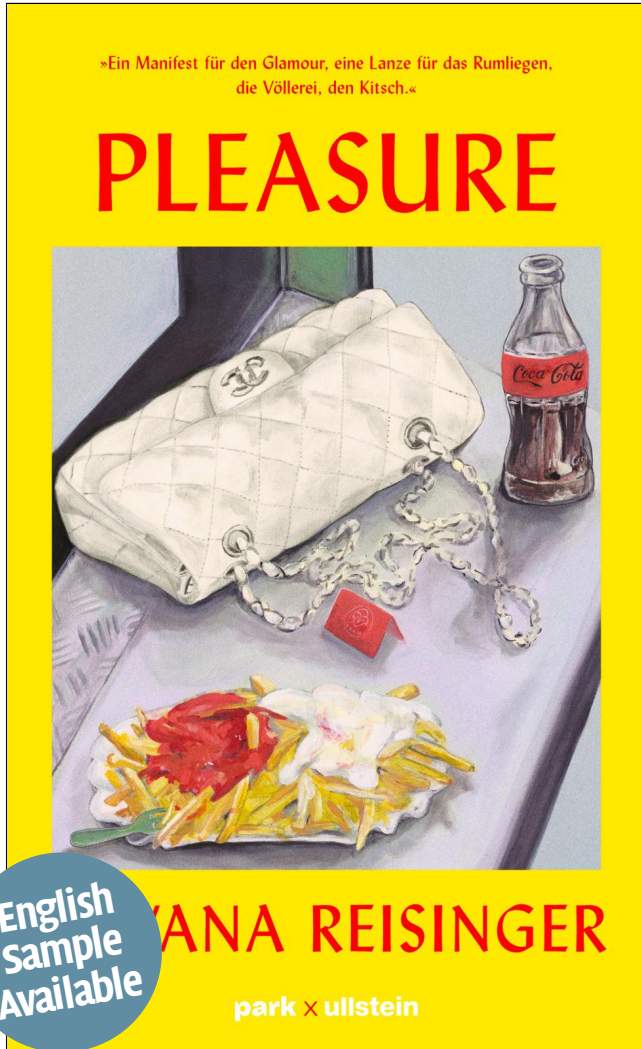

With a background in conflict research and firsthand experience as a UN weapons inspector, he approaches the question of peace with practicality and insight. What can we learn from previous wars and conflicts? And what dynamics and tools are necessary for hostile actors to talk to each other and for peaceful solutions to become possible?

Drawing from the latest research and real-life examples, Jan van Aken thoroughly examines conflict resolution strategies. From the potential of sanctions to the importance of crisis prevention, he explores diverse avenues for peace. Moreover, he considers the roles that the international community and the natural sciences can play in this endeavor.

Van Aken provides a grounded perspective on diplomatic processes, enriched by personal anecdotes and reflections. Ultimately, he reminds us that amidst the complexities of conflict, there is always a chance for peace.
